## Special Notice #2 Regarding Coronavirus (COVID-19) – March 12, 2020

Dear Students, Parents, Staff and Community Members:

The coronavirus (COVID-19) situation and guidance are changing rapidly. With the increased number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in the U.S., Livingston County Schools will continue to provide communication on the status of our school community. The intent of this message is to update you on several important aspects of our district operations.

We remain committed to the safety of our students, staff, and school community. Our County Schools will continue to follow the guidance of our Governor, the Livingston County Health Department, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, the Michigan Department of Education, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

**Accordingly, our County Schools will be open as scheduled on Friday, March 13, 2020.** However, with the fluidity of the recommendations from the local, state, and federal health departments, it is possible that a long-term school closure could become a reality. Therefore, we recommend that students and staff take home personal items at the end of the school day tomorrow. This will also assist our custodial staff with their continued efforts to sanitize our facilities.

It is our collective intent to maintain as much of our school day operations until such time that it is not considered safe by health experts to conduct regular classes.

Thank you for your attention and support regarding this important topic as safety is our number one priority.
