



All incoming participants are required to take a pre-assessment prior to enrollment to gauge reading and math levels. The results of this test decide placement into programming. Eligible participants must be at least 18 years of age by July 1 of the current school year and their graduating class must have already graduated. Also, they cannot be accessing other programming being offered by the agency or local school districts.

Adult Basic Education:

- Typically for participants who do not have a high school diploma or its equivalent, but are working towards one or the other.
- For participants who test in math and reading under a 9.0 grade level. (Students must post-test at or above a 9.0 in order to access GED preparation or high school completion.)
- An online educational program is used and participants can access a learning lab for additional support from certified teachers.

Adult Secondary Education:

- For participants who already have a high school diploma or its equivalent and are trying to improve their basic skills.
- For participants who test at or above a 9.0 in math and/or reading.
- An online educational program is used and participants can access a learning lab for additional support from certified teachers.

GED Preparation:

- Typically for students who have not graduated and need a lot of credits in order to obtain a high school diploma.
- For participants who test at or above a 9.0 in math and reading.
- An online educational program is used and participants can access a learning lab for additional support from certified teachers.
- Teachers provide recommendations, but typically participants decide when they may be ready to take one or all of the GED tests. They must register for the test online and choose their testing center and time.
- There is no GED testing center in the county; however, the closest testing centers are: Ann Arbor, East Lansing, and Highland.

High School Completion:

- Typically for students who have not graduated and need a “reasonable” amount of credits in order to obtain a high school diploma.
- For participants who test at or above a 9.0 in math and reading.
- An online educational program and teacher created work is used and participants can access a learning lab for additional support from certified teachers.
- Diploma is issued by Hartland Consolidated Schools.
- Credits/requirements are decided by Hartland Consolidated Schools and are based on the requirements of the year that the participant should have graduated.
