If you need to pick your student up early you can call our office in the morning and let us know and we will do our best to have them ready for pick up when you need them. End of day calls can be difficult for our secretarial staff to navigate due to how bust the office is at that time. Thank you for your cooperation and efforts in this regard!

Trimester #1 Report Cards...

Trimester report cards will be coming home with students on Friday, December 8th. As always, please sign the report card envelope and have your student return it to their homeroom teacher the following Monday. We will also be including results from the first NWEA Assessment of this year. I am very pleased to say that our Maltby Bullpups outperformed the national norm on the Reading and Math portions once again! Way to go Bullpups!! The information we get about students on the NWEA- it is a growth measure tool and we will be administering it one more time in March. Information will be included in your child's report card about understanding and interpreting their results.



Michigan School Meals 2023-24

Brighton Area Schools will participate in the **Michigan School Meals Program** for the 2023-24 school year. **Michigan School Meals** is a state-funded program that provides reimbursement for meals, so all students receive the meals at no cost.

To participate, students just need to show up and take a qualified meal. A school lunch consists of five components: protein, grain, fruit, vegetable and fluid milk. For a lunch to qualify it must consist of a minimum of three of the five components and one of those must be a fruit or vegetable. Incomplete meals and individual meal components will be charged at a la carte pricing.

Families are strongly encouraged to complete the Application for School Meals. The number of eligible students helps secure additional funding for the District including Title I funding.

Students and families may qualify for other District program fee reductions based on their eligibility for free or reduced-price meals including SAT testing, pay to participate, and more.





- Log into your Parent Connect account from the Maltby webpage.
- 2. Select your fifth grader.
- 3. Click the "Account" tab on the left hand side.
- 4. You will then see something like this:



- 5. Select "Online SBA Payments" on right.
- Select your student from the Drop down menu.
- 7. Then in the Item drop down, select "5th grade camp Fee"



- 8. Add the fee to the cart. If you are a chaperone, you may find another charge in that drop down menu. Add that to your cart also.
- 9. Proceed to checkout and manage the payment through PayPal.
