


Humpty Dumpty

Hey, diddle, diddle,


The cat and the fiddle,

Hickory, dickory, dock,


The mouse ran up the clock.

Hickory, dickory, dock.




Little Miss Muffet

How I wonder what you are!




Little Bo - Peep

"Wee, wee, wee, wee, wee."


