Course Description: In Architectural Drafting students will be taught basic concepts of building design and construction. Students will learn how to read and understand basic blueprints. Students will also be taught the various types of construction drawings that are needed to build a residential and

commercial buildings.

Concepts that will be covered in this class include:

-Lettering -Dimensioning -Scale Reading -Sketching

-Blueprint Reading - House Construction -Drawing Architectural Plans - Building Materials a. Construction Concepts - House Styles

b. Floor Plan Designc. Basic Arch, Plans

Prerequisites: Basic Math and Computer Skills

Introduction to CADD

Computer Usage: Windows, Keyboarding, Mouse, CADD printer, and CADD plotter

Length of course: One semester course that is open to 9-12 grades.

Materials: Paper, computer and other equipment will be provided. The student will be responsible for the care and the up keep of this equipment. Student will need a pencil for sketching and note taking everyday
